3-member panel to...

"On Justice Yashwant Varma, we had clearly said that if there is corruption in the judiciary on that matter, we all should work together and move a motion together."

Following the recovery of cash from his residence, a Supreme Court-appointed in-house inquiry panel had found Justice Varma guilty of misconduct. He had subsequently moved a plea for invalidating the report which too was dismissed by the apex court.

Yadav goes to Delhi to...

The government is making efforts to make MP the capital of milk production in the country, he said.

MP has 9% of the share in milk production across the country, but the aim is to increase MP's share in milk production to 25%, Yadav said.

MP has become a pioneer in implementing the new criminal law, he said.

More than half of export

The minister further added that "additional ad valorem rate of duty of 25% with effect from August 27, 2025 has been imposed on certain goods exported from India."

He also asserted that "No additional tariffs have been imposed on Indian exports to the USA in sectors like pharmaceuticals, and electronics as yet."

Stating that India-US bilateral trade agreement negotiations were launched in March 2025 and five rounds of negotiations have already been held, the last being from July 14-18, 2025 at Washington, Chaudhary noted that a combination of different factors such as product differentiation, demand, quality, contractual arrangements would determine the impact of reciprocal tariffs on India's exports including in textiles sector.

"The government is engaged with all stakeholders, including exporters and industry, for taking feedback of their assessment of the impact from the reciprocal tariffs imposed by the USA," he said. The minister also insisted that the Centre was attaching utmost importance to "protecting and promoting welfare of farmers, workers, entrepreneurs, exporters, MSMEs and all sections of industry."

He said the Centre was also involved in the discussions on the India-USA Bilateral Trade Agreement (BTA) with the USA with the aim to expand trade and investment through tariff stability and long-term trade predictability. Incidentally, during his visit to the United States and following his meeting with Trump in February this year, Prime Minister Narendra Modi had declared that India was desirous of almost quadrupling the annual bilateral trade with the US to \$500 billion.

SIR appears to be...

It questioned the petitioners challenging the EC's June 24 decision of conducting the SIR on the ground that it would disenfranchise one crore voters.

"If out of 7.9 crore voters, 7.24 crore voters responded to the SIR, it demolishes the theory of one crore voters missing or disenfranchised," the bench told senior advocate Kapil Sibal, appearing for petitioner and RJD leader Manoj Jha.

The top court also agreed with the EC decision to not accept Aadhaar and voter cards as conclusive proof of citizenship in the ongoing exercise and said it has to be

supported by other documents. Sibal contended that despite residents holding Aadhaar, ration and EPIC cards, officials refused to accept the documents.

"Is it your argument that people who have no documents but are in Bihar and therefore he should be considered as a voter of the state. That can be allowed. He has to show or submit some documents (sic)," the bench said.

Opposition MPs protest..

Leader of Opposition in Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi when asked about the case said "There are unlimited cases like that. Abhi picture baaki hai (there are many more cases to come)."

His sister and party general secretary, who also took part in the protest while wearing the specially made t-shirt said, "We are protesting against vote theft. Rahul Gandhi ji has revealed that the voter list contains all fake names and addresses."

The Election Commission, which has countered all these claims, has also reacted to the claims around Minta Devi stating that her age in the electoral roll was shown as such due to an error in her application form.

Meanwhile, the Opposition continued with its protests to seek a discussion on SIR in both Houses leading to adjournment of proceedings soon after they convened. The Centre had earlier stated its position through Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju that EC being an autonomous body could not be discussed in the Parliament and that the SIR matter was also pending in the Supreme Court and was therefore sub-judice and could not be discussed.

Soon a 4-km security wall to fortify Ram Mandir

The Shri Ram Janmabhoomi Trust Kshetra Trust is set to construct a 4-kilometre-long, high-security wall around the Ram Mandir complex, adding a new layer of protection to one of the country's most sensitive religious sites.

Standing 14-16 feet high and topped with a three-foot steel fence, the wall will be armed with barbed wire, electronic sensors, CCTV surveillance,

and strategically placed watchtowers. The ₹80-90 crore project, to be executed by Engineers India Limited, is scheduled to start within 15 days and finish in six to eight months.

"This wall will not only ensure the temple's security but also preserve its spiritual sanctity," said Anil Mishra, a senior Trust member. "The idea is to leave no gap for any unauthorised intrusion." Construction will begin from the northern side and proceed in

phases.

Security Alert Triggered Action

The move follows a mid-April security alert, when the Trust received an email warning of the need to bolster defences. An FIR was filed with the district police's cyber cell, which is investigating.

"Security for the Ram Mandir is non-negotiable," a senior Ayodhya police official told this correspondent. "It is not only a place of worship but a national symbol. Any lapse

could have serious consequences."

Currently, Uttar Pradesh Police and CRPF personnel guard the complex, with entry through metal detectors, baggage scanners, and designated gates. The wall will integrate with the existing monitoring system, feeding live CCTV footage into a central control room.

Layered Defence for Growing Crowds

Security experts say the structure is crucial as part of a

layered defence. "On peak days, the sheer volume of people creates opportunities for trouble," said retired IPS officer Rajiv Singh. "A strong perimeter wall is the first step in crowd control and deterrence."

Local sentiment is broadly supportive. "I come every month from Lucknow," said devotee Sunita Sharma. "It is reassuring to know the temple will be better protected." Shopkeeper Ramesh Tiwari agreed: "Festivals bring crowds — and sometimes trouble. A strong

wall will keep everyone safe."

Since the first phase of the temple was inaugurated, Ayodhya has witnessed a sharp rise in visitors, boosting tourism but also heightening security challenges.

Authorities say the wall will make the Ram Mandir one of the most secure religious sites in the country.

"This is about ensuring future generations can worship here without fear," Mishra said. Work is expected to be completed by early next year.

FLOUTING THE GUIDELINES | BJP legislator Vijay Bahadur Pathak raises concerns over the mushrooming of such schools

‘Private play schools flout govt norms in UP’

The Uttar Pradesh government had authorised the setting up of private play schools under strict norms to ensure quality early childhood education, but across the state, most operators are openly flouting these guidelines without fear of action.

The issue came under sharp focus in the Uttar Pradesh Vidhan Parishad on Monday when BJP legislator Vijay Bahadur Pathak raised concerns over the mushrooming of such schools.

As per the policy, the responsibility for pre-school education of children up to six years of age rests with the Department of Women and Child Development through the anganwadi network. In 2017, the NCPCR issued detailed guidelines for granting recognition to private play schools.

These covered establishment procedures, recognition processes, standards for infrastructure, staff qualifications, teaching ma-

terials, sports facilities, health checks, and safety measures. The Women and

Child Development Department was designated as the nodal agency to enforce

these standards.

"In Lucknow alone, an estimated 2,000 private play schools are operating, most ignoring the norms on infrastructure, teacher-student ratios, and health and safety requirements," said Pathak. India has no single law governing preschools and daycares.

Tariff: Stalin slams Centre's silence

Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M K Stalin on Tuesday said Prime Minister Narendra Modi and the BJP-led Union Government should strongly oppose the 50 per cent tariff imposed by US President Donald Trump.

"When five rounds of trade negotiations between India and the US were completed and the date was being finalised for the sixth round, why should the US President Trump arbitrarily



announce imposing an additional tariff," he asked.

Stalin also charged that Modi's lack of response to Trump's repeated claim that he had brought about the ceasefire between India and Pakistan during the Operation Sindoor, symbolised "his (Modi) weakness".

New Delhi: Five MPs, including K C Venugopal of the Congress, wrote to Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla on Tuesday over the incident of a Thiruvananthapuram-Delhi flight they were travelling in being diverted to Chennai and demanded action on alleged "breach of privilege" by Air India.
